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## 1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The World Games Field Archery event will be conducted to FITA Field Archery Rules.

### Overview

There are 3 disciplines in World Games Field Archery competition will be Men and Women Barebow (AR-B), Men and Women Compound (AR-C) and Men and Women Recurve (AR-R).

The field archery competition will be conducted to FITA Field Rules although there are some modifications for the World Games.

There are four main differences –

- (1) The number of participants for the World Games is limited to 96 competitors unlike the World Field Championships where there is no limit to competitor numbers.
- (2) There shall be two Qualifying Rounds (one Unmarked and one Marked) followed by Semi Finals and Finals. Eliminations round will not be conducted.
- (3) There are no junior divisions.
- (4) There is no Team Event

## 7. WELCOME – OFFICIAL LANGUAGE

## 9. VISA

With the formal The World Games 2009 invitation and passport with validity at least six month upon entry, participants (VIPs, athletes, officials, extra officials, KOC contractors including the technical staff from the equipment suppliers) are eligible for Visa-exempt entry (China, Hong Kong, Macau included).

Duration of stay starts from the next day of arrival for 30 days and is not extendable.

Newly added participants after May 15th, 2009 are not eligible for Visa-exempt entry. Please apply for Visa through regular procedures.

### Volunteer Information

1. The team attaché mainly speak Chinese and English. Other assistant languages such as French, Deutsch, Spanish, and Japanese are also available the during service period. Those of team attachés who can speak assistant languages will wear specific badges which can be easily recognized when on duty.
2. Team Attaché are in charge of translation, information delivery, companion service ranging from the hotel to venue and its surroundings.
3. There are service counters located in official hotels with consulting volunteers to provide information services for shopping, tour packages and others.
4. The rest of volunteers being capable of speaking other foreign languages are distributed in airports, venues, hotels, and accreditation center on demand.

## **11. QUALIFIER / CONFIRMATION**

A maximum of 96 archers will take part in the archery event of the 8<sup>th</sup> World Games. There will be women and men in the Barebow, Recurve and Compound divisions.

### **QUOTA PLACES**

The quota places will be granted by FITA according to the final results of the 2008 FITA World Field Archery Championship.

Countries will qualify for quota places in accordance with the results list and will be invited to nominate archers to FITA for entry into the World Games. There will be a maximum of 2 archers in each class and division from each country.

The host country will have one free spot in each class and division, however, the host country still can only have a maximum number of two spots in each class and division.

In addition FITA and IWGA may allow 1 free spot in each class and division for invited countries – all within the allowed quota of 96 archers

## 12. COMPETITION FORMAT

The World Games Field Archery competition format –

- (1) The World Games Field Archery format involves two Qualifying Rounds – Day One 24 targets of unmarked FITA Field – Day Two 24 targets of marked FITA Field Event.
- (2) Following the 2 Qualifying Rounds the top four archers in each division then shoot the semi final round. The No 1 ranked archer shoots against the No 4 ranked archer and the 2<sup>nd</sup> ranked archer shoots against the 3<sup>rd</sup> ranked archer. The semi final round is a 4 marked target round.
- (3) Following the semi finals, the two losers move to the Bronze Medal Match while the winners move to the Gold Medal match. The Medal Match is a 4 marked target round

## 13. DRAWING OF LOTS FOR STARTING ORDER

DRAW FOR SHOOTING POSITIONS  
Refer 2008 FITA Shooting Rules section 3.16

3.16.1 The Organizers will allocate to each athlete a registration number (back number). These numbers will be worn by the athletes and be shown in the program to enable the spectators and others to recognise them.

3.16.1.1 The back number will remain unchanged throughout the tournament (with the exception of article 3.16.1.9).

3.16.1.2 The initial allocation of athletes to shooting groups in Field and the order of shooting will be arranged by the Organizers. This can be done electronically, or manually as follows:

- An urn will contain as many cards as there are Member Associations competing, each card bearing the name of one Member Association;
- The Chairperson or Secretary of the Organizing Committee will first draw one card;
- From another urn the back numbers of all athletes of that Member Association will be drawn; these will be allocated one to each target (or shooting group) in the order in which they are drawn;
- Having finished with one Member Association, another is drawn. The same procedure will continue until all back numbers have been drawn.

3.16.1.3 Athletes will be allocated targets and shooting positions as they are drawn, thus:

- 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, 5A, 6A to the last target
- 1B, 2B, 3B, 4B, 5B, 6B to the last target
- 1C, 2C, 3C, 4C, 5C, 6C to the last target

In Field athletes will be allocated targets, shooting positions and back numbers based on the draw, provided that athletes from the same nations are to be separated by at least one group.

Women and men, and when applicable, different divisions, will be drawn separately.

3.16.1.5 Lists of athletes, according to target/group order and alphabetical order will be made available to all FITA officers, Judges and athletes and officials at least two days before the first day of competition

3.16.1.7 The minutes of the proceedings will be handed to the Technical Delegate at the Team Captains' meeting before the tournament.

3.16.1.8 Team officials and athletes may attend the draw but will not have the right to speak except for Team Captains requesting consideration of article 3.16.1.4

## **14. INQUIRY**

FITA Rule 1.13.2

Appeals against rulings by the Judges must be presented, in writing, by Team Captains, or appellants if no Team Captain has been designated. No appeal can be made against the value of an arrow.

*An intention to appeal when it might affect the progression of an athlete from one stage of the competition to the next, must be expressed in writing and lodged with the chairperson of the Tournament Judge Commission and the Jury within 5 minutes of the end of the relevant round or match, whichever comes first. During the Finals of Match play rounds, the notice of intent to file an appeal must be given within 5 minutes of the end of the match, or prior to the start of the next match, whichever is first.*

*The written appeal must be lodged with the Jury within 15 minutes of the end of the relevant round or match, whichever comes first.*

An appeal is subject to a 50 US\$ fee that will be returned if the appeal is upheld or if the Jury of Appeal decides that it is appropriate.

As soon as an appeal is received, a communication to the team captains will be made that an appeal was made and what the appeal is about.

The Jury must be available at all times during the Championship, including the day of Official Practice. During match play competitions the Jury must be present on the competition field.

Jury decisions shall be minuted and submitted to the appellant, the Chairperson of the Tournament Judge Commission and the Organizers before the beginning of the next stage of the competition or before the awarding of prizes.

The ruling made by the Jury of Appeal is final

## 24. MEDAL AWARD CEREMONIES

### Medal Award Ceremonies

1. KOC has collected the number of medals needed for all sports and will proceed with the production accordingly. Each VM team has to contact Culture & Tourism Dept for collection schedule and will be responsible for safekeeping. For any reason that causes a cancellation or postponement of award ceremony, all the medals have to be returned to KOC.

2. In addition to be awarded with medals, every medallist will also be given a mascot of TWG 2009.
3. KOC will provide volunteers and procedure of medal ceremony and the VM team needs to arrange rehearsal schedule and handover the correct number of medals to the medal ceremony team.

### **National Flags**

KOC will provide participating national flags for venue decoration and award ceremony; after each event is finished; all the flags have to be collected back to KOC from VM team.

## **25. MEDICAL SERVICES, TRAINER, FICS SERVICE**

Medical, trainer, and FICS services will be performed throughout the competition. In order to prevent medical dispute during the games, there should be clear definition as to which party should be on the field first to help an injured athlete on site at the orientation meeting prior to the event. Thus, the judge can appoint the right person to perform medical assistance according to the meeting decision.

### **MEDICAL SERVICES**

1. Each venue has at least one First-Aid Station, consisting of 1 doctor, 2 nurses, 2 EMT medical dispatch personnel from the Emergency Department of Fire Bureau, 2 volunteers and 1 ambulance on site in the venue.
2. No oral medicine will be provided at venues.
3. For hospital treatment, injured athletes or staff should be accompanied by teammates or team attaché to the hospitals. Before being discharged from hospital, the injured should pay for medical fees (NT cash only) and ask for receipt as well as diagnosis certificate for insurance compensation.
4. First-Aid station is set up 30 minutes before the training and the competition.
5. Under the circumstance of companion with the official team doctor, the team doctor is the main one in charge of injured athletes, and the medical personnel serves as the assistant who stand by on doctors' demand.
6. After completion of medical treatment, the whole process should be recorded in the medical record form. If athletes are seriously injured that they may be advised to quit the game by doctors which the advice / decision must be made in compliance with the IF medical regulations. It depends on the final decision of athletes or coaches that whether they insist to continue the game. If they decide to continue, there should be an agreement released by referees and signed by athletes.

### **Trainer, FICS service**

All chiropractic treatments and sports taping must only be performed by the FICS and Athletic Trainers under the consent and request from the athlete, the head of delegation or the coach. Any sports injury that requires doctor's prescription or intrusive medical treatment will be referred to the first aid medical team of the KOC.

**1.Athletic Trainers:**

- (1) The KOC will provide sufficient number of athletic trainers in 26 events during the Games.
- (2) The Athletic Trainers are physiotherapists, athletic trainers and students of athletic training. They are certificated by national examination or studying in sports medication relative department in university.

**2.FICS:**

- (1) FICS will be performing chiropractic service at specific venues according to the request received from IFs.
- (2) FICS service is carried out in conjunction with IFs' current medical protocols. There will be meetings scheduled with the various Federations prior to the commencement of the Games to ensure all parties are aware of these protocols.
- (3) VM team is responsible for providing medical sundries and other relevant equipment.
- (4) FICS service will be in compliance with the local medical law and regulations.

**26. DOPING CONTROLS****Authority to test:**

Pursuant to the IWGA Anti-Doping Rules, all athletes participating in The World Games shall be subject to In-Competition Testing for the duration between their official registration at the Games and the Closing Ceremony of the Games. The authority to conduct and perform testing is with International World Games Association (IWGA), Kaohsiung Organizing Committee and Chinese Taipei Anti-Doping Agency (CTADA) affiliated to Chinese Taipei Olympic Committee.

The chair of IWGA Medical Committee or his/her representative is responsible to oversee all Anti-Doping Testing during the World Games.

**Testing Standards:**

The testing conducted during the 8<sup>th</sup> World Games Kaohsiung under supervision of IWGA Medical Committee shall be in conformity with the International Standard for Testing in force at the time of testing.

**Doping Control Station:**

Entrance of Doping Control Stations is only for authorized persons.

The transportation from competition venue to doping control stations, doping control stations to accommodated hotels or specified places by the athletes after necessary doping control procedures would be by contract taxi.

The doping control stations are located in National Sun Yat-Sen University and Chung Cheng Stadium of each.

### **Analysis of Samples**

All samples of athletes will be collected based on the doping control procedures in accordance with International Standard for Testing, and will be analyzed in a WADA- accredited laboratory, in this case, the laboratory in Tokyo, Japan shall apply.

### **Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE)**

Any participating athlete requires a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) shall file the application together with medical documents required to IWGA Medical Committee for approval latest twenty-one (21) days before the Games.

### **Governing Rules**

The IWGA Anti-Doping Rules shall be applicable during the The World Games, whereas the World Anti-Doping Code shall apply.

Doping Control Guide for The World Games approved by the IWGA Medical Committee will be available for all participating delegations before their departure for the Games. Test Distribution Planning will be elaborated by the IWGA Medical Committee, which shall be followed by CTADA under the authority of IWGA and Kaohsiung Organizing Committee.

## **27. ACCREDITATION**

The delegations will be accredited upon their arrival in Kaohsiung. The Accreditation Center is located in Kaohsiung City Hall.

The accreditation is personal, non transferable and compulsory to have access to the training and competition fields as well as for the official transportation system of the Organising Committee and entering Catering Zone(s).

The accreditation identifies individuals participating in the event and indicates their right to access to the different zones.

Controls will be made at the entrance to each area. All participants are required to wear the accreditation card at any time in the competition venue.

At the Accreditation Center, the heads of delegation are requested to check the names of the delegation members, verify accommodation requirements, and make the necessary payments.

The KOC will copy all competitors and officials' passports for proof of identity, control of Nationality as well as for anti-doping purposes (athletes).

## **28. INSURANCE**

**Medical Health and Accident Insurances** – “This is required by the IWGA Rules.”

- (1) Proof of health and accident insurance policy (including medical coverage) for every participant is mandatory by the IWGA Rules and will be checked upon arrival prior to the accreditation.
- (2) Any individual who is unable to present the insurance proof for checking

shall purchase the insurance at the Accreditation Center to receive the full rights of participation.

1. Insurance and Medical Payment Procedure

- (1) If the health and accident insurance is purchased upon arrival, the local insurance company will be accounted for the claims to its maximum limits. However, the insured or his/her teammate is responsible for any excess medical expenses that incurred over the limit. There are two payment options for the excess expenses: by cash (NTD only) or by credit card at accreditation center. (Please refer to Medical Payment Procedure 2-2 for more details.)
- (2) If the health and accident insurance is purchased prior to the arrival, the insured or his/her teammate is responsible for any medical payments incurred. (Please refer to Medical Payment Procedure 2-2.)
- (3) Due to the long process of determination on either responsibility or the amount of damages incurred in the public liability insurance, the insured or his/her teammate should pay for any medical payments incurred in advance. (Please refer to Medical Payment Procedure 2-2.) After the responsibility is confirmed and compensation amount is approved by the local insurance company, KOC will remit the compensation to the insured's account. (The contact information and bank account details of the insured are required.)

2. According to the Health Insurance Act, the insurance premiums are based on the age of the insured. However, a simplified version has been calculated and quoted by the insurance company as follows:

### **30. TELEVISION BROADCAST**

Public Television Service (PTS) is the host broadcaster of TWG 2009. PTS will form alliance with other news and sports channels to maximize domestic coverage, and seek worldwide exposure via international channels. Opening and Closing Ceremonies will be live broadcasted via one main domestic channel and two cable channels with at least 80% coverage.

Chunghwa Telecom will webcast live and/or highlight programs via its platforms of MOD (Movie on Demand), IPTV (Internet TV), HiChannel(Website) and 3G mobile phone.

Live broadcasting sport events include--Dance Sport (Standard, Latin and R&R), Gymnastics (Rhythmic/Acrobatics/Tumbling/Trampoline/Aerobics) and Roller Sport (Speed), and selective live programs from Korfbal and Rugby Sevens-

### **31. MEDIA REPRESENTATIVES AND MEDIA CONFERENCES**

1. Main Media Center (MMC) will be allocated at the Main Stadium, and other venues will be equipped with "Media Service Center at Venues" (MSCVs).
2. MMC shall be close to competition venues, with a capacity of hosting 15-100 people.
3. MMC provides working stations and a social area for media staff; media services include graphic signals, news release in print, pictures, latest competition schedules and light refreshment are also offered.
4. Only accredited media staff is allowed in the MMC.
5. A "photo area" will be allocated next to competition area for accredited media photographer. A well route planning and well trained volunteers are required to avoid conflicts with competition *per se*.
6. Daily press conferences will be convened at MMC.
